- In many legal settings, specialized forms of written communications are required. In many others, writing is the medium in which a lawyer must express their analysis of an issue and seek to persuade others on their client's behalf. In view of the foregoing, examine holistically, the aims, objectives and purposes of legal writing.
- 2. Legal writing comes in various forms and shapes. Critically examine the legal insterials that a lawyer has to write at one time or the other, in the course of his profession.
- 3. By classification. Legal Writing can be Descriptive, Narrative, Expository or Argumentative. Compare and Contrast each of these heads and give an example of each.

An attorney's failure to perform adequate legal research or write well can violate the attorney's professional responsibility. A demonstrated lack of competence in legal writing can lead to breach of ethical rules and can lead to a reprimand, suspension or disbarment for the practice of law.
